SPITFIRE MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP

The Spitfire Memorial Defence Fellowship, launched in Canberra in 1998 in conjunction with the University of New South Wales at ADFA, continues to grow with 16 Fellowships having been awarded. The Fellowship, for research into any aspect relating to the defence of Australia now stands at up to \$35,000 annually.

Of particular interest is that our 2017 Fellow, Dr. Robert Dane from OCIUS Technologies, has also won several design awards, including the prestigious "Australian Marine Innovation Award - Defence" at the International Marine Exposition at Darling Harbour in Sydney in October 2017.

FELLOWSHIP PRESENTATION 2018

The presentation of the 2018 Spitfire Memorial Defence Fellowship was held at Government House, Canberra on Monday 4 December 2017 and this year was awarded to Dr. Jai Galliot from the UNSW at AFDA in Canberra. The title of Dr. Galliot's submission was "Australian Military Officer Attitudes Towards to Adoption of Autonomous Systems" Further details of his research project can be found on the Association web site. Following the presentation at Government House, a dinner at the Canberra Yacht club was attended by Dr Galliot and members of the Spitfire Association and special guests including the British Defence Attaché Brig. Andrew Harrison and Mrs Harrison.

- Warbirds Downunder (Temora)

SPITFIRES IN AUSTRALIA

There are at present several Spitfire rebuilds taking place in Australia, however, these are mainly for static display. Of course, visitors to Canberra can view the Spitfire on display at the Australian War Memorial. There are two airworthy examples flying regularly from the Temora Aviation Museum including the Mk V111 (RG -V) painted in the colours of the late Wing Commander Bobby Gibbes, with its distinctive shark's mouth painted on the lower engine cowling
