VALE; JOSEPH LYSLE ROBERTS

It was with great sadness that we reported the passing of our lifetime Spitfire Association Vice President and World War II veteran Joseph Lysle Roberts who died on Monday 29th October. Lysle was married to Pam (deceased) for 69 years and they had three children, Warwick, Angus and Martin (Reg.) Lysle attended Knox Grammar School and became Captain of the school, Senior Cadet Under-Officer and captain of all major sports teams. Lysle was offered a commission in the AIF, but refused as his desire was to fly Spitfires. After leaving school Lysle enlisted in the RAAF in Sydney on 2nd January 1943. Lysle served with 457 Sqn. And 2 Aircraft Depot (2AD) in Richmond, NSW and was discharged on 5th February 1946, then joining his family's jewellery business, Fairfax and Roberts.

Like each of us, Lysle had a love of this fine aeroplane, the Spitfire. Unlike any of us on recent committees, his perspective was as a former Spitfire pilot. He relied on the Spitfire to keep him safe against a determined enemy, whilst also using it's remarkable capabilities to make his enemies feel distinctly unsafe.

Lysle often talked about how he'd survived the second world war in large part to R.J. Mitchell's marvellous machine and a big helping hand from lady luck. He did not say much about his steely determination as the third essence in being able to see the war out, he didn't need to. His long life is a fine reflection of that determination, seen in few people and a great humanity to balance it.

Lysle served tirelessly on the Spitfire Association Committee for many decades, often as President and lead members on some great reunions to Darwin. His dedication to the Spitfire Memorial Defence Fellowship and the objectives set out by the founders is his visibly enduring contribution to the Spitfire, it's pilots and ground crews and to our Association. Many have contributed to the SMDF, however, Lysle's determination and humanity has seen it mature into the fellowship that we know today.

Lysle will be sadly missed but his legacy will live on. Lest we forget.

The Spitfire Memorial Defence Fellowship presentation for 2019 was held at Government House in Canberra on Thursday 6th December 2018 and the award this year was presented to Dr Elena Sitnikova from the UNSW at ADFA for her research project, "A Cyber-Physical Approach to Improve Assurance for Remotely-Operated Mission Systems and Aircraft Payloads". Governor-General Sir Peter Cosgrove, was unexpectedly called away to attend the funeral of President George Bush and the award was presented by the Chief of the Defence Force, General Angus Campbell. An introduction and background to the award was given by the Deputy Chief of the Air Force, Air Vice Marshal Gavin Turnbull. We are looking forward to the final report on Dr Sitnikova's study towards the end of next year.
