GOVERNMENT HOUSE PRESENTATION

The Spitfire Memorial Defence Fellowship for 2020 was held at Government House in Canberra on Monday 9th December and the award was presented to Dr Nour Moustafa from the UNSW at ADFA by His Excellency General the Honourable David Hurley AO DSC. Dr Moustafa in his first

fellowship followed on from last years SMDF awardee, Dr Elena Sitnikova with a continuation of the topic theme being "Cyber detection and countermeasures" with this year adding self-repairing and inclusion of the Internet-of-Things (IoT).

Dr Harvey Marchant managed the process this year for the first time and applied his knowledge and expertise as one of our nation's leading academics It was also the first year for the new Deputy Rector Professor Harvinder Sidhu and his first selection panel for the SMDF.

REPORT ON PROGRESS OF SMDF RESEARCH

Dr Elena Sitnikova was awarded the Spitfire Memorial Defence Fellowship for 2019 and she had reported recently on the completion of her research. The title of her research project was "A Cyber-

Physical Approach to Improve Mission Assurance for Remotely-Operated Aerial Systems and Aircraft Payloads" or to put it more simply, systems to protect aerial drones from cyber attacks.

The increasing prevalence of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) in the military and civilian sectors has been accompanied by an increase in sophisticated malicious activities.

This project has helped to design and validate the principle of discovering zero-day attacks against UAV networks allowing the safety of UAVs against cyber threats.

MISSION ACCOMPLISHED

The adventurous flight around the world by the Silver Spitfire G-IRTY was completed on 6th December when it landed at it's home base at Goodwood in England after it epic flight around the world covering some 43,000 kilometres in 4 months and was accompanied by a PC-12 support aircraft.

The flight was wholly within the Northern Hemisphere and consisted of 74 stops on the way through some exotic locations such as Russia etc.

The flight was sponsored by IWC, a Swiss watch company who specialise in pilot's watches and the Spitfire performed faultlessly during it's marathon flight. Full details of the Spitfire and its epic flight can be found on the web site at; www.silverspitfire.com
